New Members Sworn In, Mayor and Deputy Mayor Elected by Morris Township Committee

Jeff Grayzel and Mark Gyorfy sworn in to the Township Committee; Committeeman Grayzel elected to serve as Mayor, Committeewoman Cathy Wilson elected Deputy Mayor

Morris Township, NJ – Last night, two new members were sworn in to the Morris Township Committee, the five-member governing body of Morris Township. Jeff Grayzel and Mark Gyorfy took the oath of office for their three-year terms. The Township Committee then selected newly elected Committeeman Jeff Grayzel as Mayor, and Committeewoman Cathy Wilson as Deputy Mayor for 2019.



“I am grateful to the public for again electing me to the Township Committee,” stated **Mayor Jeff Grayzel**, who was sworn in to his third term. “I promise our residents that I will work diligently to implement the government values I have campaigned on. I have learned a great deal in my previous 6 years on the Committee, and am now prepared to lead our Municipality as Mayor.
