Fundraiser Invitation – Declined

To City Council President Giattino,

Your insulting tone-deaf invitation to your fundraiser is unbelievable. I demand that you remove me from your fundraising list immediately. I want nothing to do with your re-election campaign!

The audacity of your hypocrisy to solicit funds from a Hoboken city official who has twice warned you to stay away from the HHA is reprehensible. You write, "As many of you know the hardest thing for me to do is ask for money but campaigns cost money." No, Council President Giattino; "the hardest thing" for you to do is signing the Integrity Pledge.
