In addition, under my guidance, the SDA made a concerted effort to reach out to many community organizations, business organizations, and other stakeholders throughout 31 SDA districts.

Building new, high-quality schools in some of our most under-served communities is critical to the future of our State. I've worked my entire life fighting for the rights of New Jersey's most vulnerable residents and that is the spirit I brought every day to the job of the SDA CEO.

I share Governor Phil Murphy's vision of bringing a stronger and fairer New Jersey to all residents, including our children. I thank Governor Murphy for giving me this incredible opportunity and look forward to the future success of the organization.
