## Gail Collins

## ON AMERICAN Women's History



Gail Collins joined *The New York Times* in 1995 as a member of the editorial board and later became an Op-Ed columnist. In 2001, she was appointed editorial page editor—the first woman to hold that post at the paper. Since 2013, Ms. Collins has been a member of the Pulitzer Prize Board.

Before joining *The New York Times*, Ms. Collins was a columnist for *Newsday* and the New York Daily News and a reporter for United Press International. She started her journalism career in Connecticut, where she founded the Connecticut State News Bureau. She is a graduate of Marquette University and earned a master's degree in government from the University of Massachusetts.

Ms. Collins is the author of numerous books, including America's Women: Four Hundred Years of Dolls, Drudges, Helpmates, and Heroines; Scorpion Tongues: Gossip, Celebrity, and American Politics; and The Millennium Book, which she co-authored with her husband, Dan Collins. Her latest book is No Stopping Us Now: The Adventures of Older Women in American History.
