It is on this _24th_ day of September, 2020 ORDERED that Defendants COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND and COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS, appear and show cause before the Superior Court at the Cumberland County Courthouse in Bridgeton, New Jersey before The Honorable _____Benjamin C. Telsey, A.J.S.C_____ on ___October 19th___ at ____9:00 a.m. _____ or as soon thereafter as counsel can be heard, on why an Order should not be issued preliminarily enjoining and restraining Defendants COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND and COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS from: (A) Laying off any members of PBA Local 231 effective November 7, 2020; and (B) Granting such other relief as the court deems equitable and just. And it is further ORDERED that:

1. A copy of this order to show cause, verified complaint, legal memorandum and any supporting affidavits or certifications submitted in support of this application be served upon County Counsel John Carr and outside labor attorney Kathleen M. Bonczyk, attorney for Defendants , via facsimile or electronic mail within __7__ days of the date hereof, and be served on Defendants COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND and COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS, within __7__ days of the date hereof in accordance with \underline{R} . 4:4-3 and \underline{R} . 4:4-4, this being original process; unless Mr. Carr and/or Ms. Bonczyk waives such requirement.

2. Plaintiff must file with the Court its proof of service of the pleadings on Defendant or its counsel no later than three (3) days before the return date.

3. Defendants shall file and serve a written response to this order to show cause and the request for entry of injunctive relief and proof of service by ___October 7th_____, 2020. The original documents must be filed with the clerk of the Superior Court in the county listed above. A directory of these offices is available in the Civil Division Management Office in the county listed above and online at njcourts.gov/forms/10153_deptyclerklawref.pdf. You must send a copy of your opposition papers directly to Judge ______. You must also send a copy of your opposition papers to Plaintiff's attorney whose name and address

appears above. A telephone call will not protect your rights; you must file your opposition and pay the required fee and serve your opposition on your adversary, if you

want the court to hear your opposition to the injunctive relief Plaintiff is seeking.

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4. Plaintiff must file and serve any written reply to Defendant's order to show cause opposition by _____October 13th_____, 2020. The reply papers must be filed with the Clerk of the Superior Court in the county listed above and a copy of the reply papers must be sent directly to the chambers of Judge _____Telsey____.

5. If Defendant does not file and serve opposition to this order to show cause, the application will be decided on the papers on the return date and relief may be granted by default, provided that Plaintiff files a proof of service and a proposed form of order at least three days prior to the return date.

6. If Plaintiff has not already done so, a proposed form of order addressing the relief sought on the return date (along with a self-addressed return envelope with return address and postage) must be submitted to the court no later than three (3) days before the return date.

7. Defendant take notice that Plaintiff has filed a lawsuit against you in the Superior Court of New Jersey. The verified complaint attached to this order to show cause states the basis of the lawsuit. If you dispute this complaint, you, or your attorney, must file a written answer to the complaint and proof of service within 35 days from the day of service of this order to show cause; not counting the day you received it.

These documents must be filed with the Clerk of the Superior Court in the county listed above. A directory of these offices is available in the Civil Division Management Office in the county listed above and online at

njcourts.gov/forms/10153_deptyclerklawref.pdf. Include the proper filing fee payable to the "Treasurer State of New Jersey." You must also send a copy of your Answer to Plaintiff's attorney whose name and address appear above. A telephone call will not

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protect your rights; you must file and serve your Answer (with the fee) or judgment may be entered against you by default. Please note: Opposition to the order to show cause is not an Answer and you must file both. Please note further: if you do not file and serve an Answer within 35 days of this Order, the court may enter a default against you for the relief plaintiff demands.
