INTRODUCTION — *by John Van Vliet*

What had been known as the Millennials List has, like Millennials themselves, grown and matured in its own right. Now dubbed “Rising Generations,” the individuals showcased in this Insider NJ publication are, many of them, Millennials, but also Generation Z, the up-and-coming generation out of school and making their impact in the workplace and in politics as the future face of New Jersey leadership. The Rising Generations features here are representative of the younger side of New Jersey’s great movers and shakers, but may also serve as role models for Gen Z and the youngest generation yet, Gen Alpha (born 2012 and on)—the children of Millennials and elder Gen Z.

Politics and commerce are generally dominated by the grey-haired elite, as ascendancy takes time and work. But leadership opportunities are not, and ought not to be, exclusive of younger faces. Some have come into such positions on their own, by creating the businesses and roles they find themselves captaining. Others have put their time, talent, and energy into contributing to entities

and causes they believe in and champion. On the political scene, younger voices are on center stage in New Jersey. The Garden State hasn’t sent a Republican to the US Senate since 1972, save the brief appointees Nicholas Brady and Jeffrey Chiesa, but the man who sought to break that streak was Republican US Senate candidate Curtis Bashaw, a Baby Boomer entrepreneur who found his calling and passion in the hospitality industry. His opponent was CD-3 Congressman Andy Kim, a “Xennial” (that is, the cusp of Gen X and Millennial, those born 1977-1983) at age 42. Kim went into the State Department and became a civilian national security advisor in Afghanistan and later to President Obama. Although Kim won, both candidates represented historic opportunities for New Jersey’s junior-Senate seat given their backgrounds, representing demographic shifts in political representation.

The younger face on the state-level is Kim’s. Nationally, the figure is that of Millennial VP-elect, Senator JD Vance of Ohio. For context, the youngest Vice

President of the United States of America was John C. Breckinridge, only 36-years-old while serving under James Buchanan. Future president Richard Nixon was 40 when he became Vice President to Dwight Eisenhower. In a curious contrast, looking at 2024, the third-youngest Vice President-elect is running alongside the oldest President-elect in US history, Donald Trump, 78. Trump now holds that record since President Joe Biden, 81, stepped away from seeking re-election in favor of his own Vice President, the 59-year-old Kamala Harris. In either instance, there would have been an elevated possibility that a re-elected Biden or Trump would not be able to finish his second term, leaving either

Harris—born late 1964 so technically a Baby Boomer, or a “Xoomer” on the cusp of Gen X—or Vance, a Millennial, as acting-president.

The returning Trump Administration (minus former Vice President Mike Pence—a vocal opponent of his former boss following the January 6th insurrection when crowds threatened to hang him for certifying the 2020 election), is looking more generationally diverse than the first. Americans can anticipate seeing a wide stretch of ages and experiences in the transition. The new-again incoming president’s core shows where generations have joined in the national movement, spearheaded by the billionaire Baby

Boomer 45th/47th president; alongside Gen X mega-billionaire advisor Elon Musk; Millennial millionaire JD Vance; and Millennial billionaire advisor Vivek Ramaswamy.

In New Jersey, such heavy portfolios are far less common in the halls of power. Nevertheless, the saturation of younger generations in key positions of leadership in both the public and private sectors provides a source of strength for the Garden State’s vibrant and innovative society now, and in the days ahead.

1. ANDY KIM

There are few New Jersey figures who have had such a meteoric rise and a profound effect on the state's political landscape than Congressman Andy Kim. First elected to Congress in 2018, Kim launched his Senate candidacy in the fall of 2023 – considered a long-shot at the time – following the indictment of then-Senator Menendez. He proved naysayers wrong at nearly every step of way. One of those steps happened to be his lawsuit which ended the 'county party line' in the Senate primary, which subsequently will have the

effect of reshaping primary politics in the Garden State into the future. That alone warrants Kim as among the most consequential figures in New Jersey politics, not just this year, or this past election cycle, but at large. Kim ranked #1 on the 2023 edition of this list, which stated he 'faces a challenging primary, to be sure, with establishment support coalescing behind First Lady Tammy Murphy, but he's posted impressive fundraising hauls and has been able to generate enthusiasm from rank-and-file Democrats and from the progres-

sive wing of the Democratic Party. Should Kim prevail in the primary, and in the general election, he would be among the youngest in the Senate.' And so it came to be. Kim ascends to the Senate, one of its youngest members and the first Korean-American in the chamber. For the time being, his influence in the chamber will be muted, as a freshman in the minority party, but there's no dispute that, as a driving catalyst for the 'end of the party line', his influence led to one of the most important shifts in New Jersey politics.

2. LAMONICA MCIVER

The former Newark Central Ward Councilwoman was the youngest elected to the city's governing body, and earlier this year succeeded the late Rep. Donald Payne to represent the 10th Congressional District. Prevailing in a special election during the summer, and

then winning a full-term in November, Congresswoman McIver is the youngest member of the state's congressional delegation, and the state's second African-American female federal representative. As she embarks on a new chapter in her public service career, one of

her lasting achievements during her tenure as Newark's Council President was the passage of the ordinance lowering the voting age for Board of Education elections, saying it's 'good for young people, good for Newark, and good for New Jersey'.

3. YENJAY HU & ANJALI KRISHNAMURTI

5. BRITNEE TIMBERLAKE

Having served as an Essex County Commissioner, and several terms in the Assembly, Timberlake was elected to the Senate representing the 34th Legislative District in November 2023, and is among the upper chamber's youngest members. She continues to be a strong advocate on issues affecting younger residents on the state.



6. ROB MENENDEZ, JR.

The Congressman this year stared down a primary challenge that tested his mettle, and tested his family name. He beat back the challenge handily, proving his political staying power. Before the arrival of Congresswoman McIver, he was the youngest member of the state's Congressional delegation, and is still amongst the youngest in the nation.



7. TIM HILLMANN

A veteran of the Statehouse and Governor Murphy's Administration, Hillmann ascended to the Chief of Staff post earlier this year as the Governor heads into the final stretch of his tenure. Hillmann will have an impact on the Governor's final legislative goals and initiatives – and legacy.

8. DYESE DAVIS

The Chief of Staff to 11th Legislative District Senator Vin Gopal, Dyese holds several leadership roles, and was elected Monmouth County Democratic Committee Chairwoman this summer, succeeding David Brown, becoming a trail-blazer as the youngest African-American woman to lead a county party organization.



9. VIN GOPAL

The 11th Legislative District Senator is immensely influential in just about every corner of the state and is one of the youngest in the Legislature. A proven vote-getter who led his slate to a full victory in November 2023, Gopal has been a powerful voice on a range of issues, including student literacy, education funding, and pre-K expansion.



10. A'DORIAN MURRAY THOMAS

First elected to the Newark Board of Education, the city's youngest, in 2023 Murray-Thomas was just elected to serve on the Essex County Commission Board, the youngest on the county's governing body. She is a NAACP NextGen Leadership Fellow and is the founder and CEO of SHE Wins, Inc., a leadership program for middle school and high school girls in Newark, with a focus on those affected by violence.

11. JUSTIN MUSELLA

The Republican Councilman in Parsippany is an effervescent campaigner with a strong ground game, and has built his own network of local support, which he hopes will propel him further as he mounts a strong candidacy in the Republican mayoral primary in 2025. Outside of his council service, Musella has advocated for Republican engagement of young voters.



12. RAJ MUKHERJI

Having served several terms in the Assembly and now serving in the Senate representing the 33rd Legislative District, Mukherji is a leading voice for the younger generation in the Legislature. He's been on the forefront of the movement to lower the voting age, saying that '16-, 17-year-olds should be enfranchised, should be able to vote in every election', noting to naysayers that the 'sky will not fall when we do it.'



13. ZACH DOUGHERTY

The recent college graduate has long-been a young activist for youth empowerment and involvement in state politics and government, and his advocacy led to the passage of legislation to establish a Legislative Youth Council. This November, he made a play for a Toms River council seat.

The four recently launched 'Gen Z For New Jersey', a political action committee aimed at empowering and energizing young leaders across the state and ensuring generational representation in government.



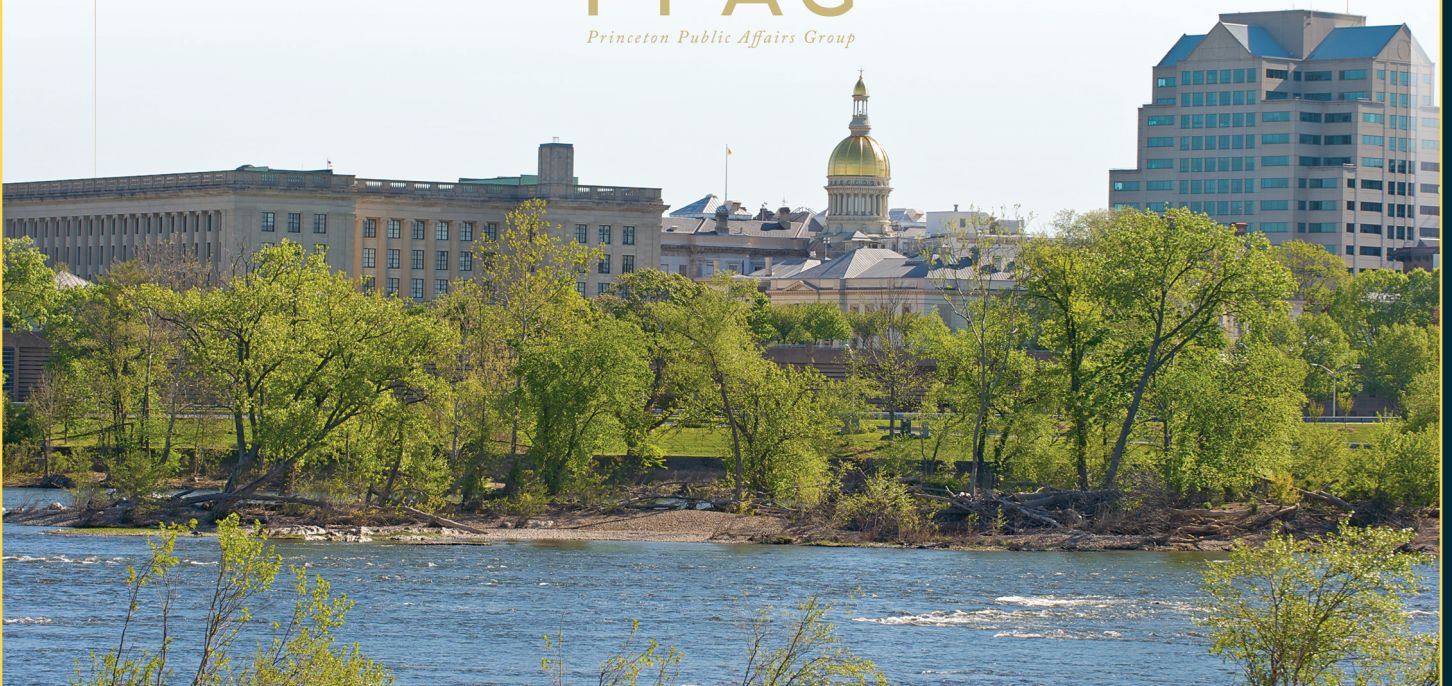

An Essex County Undersheriff for the past 15 years, Jones easily won election as Essex County Sheriff this past November, and will be the county's first African-American in the position.



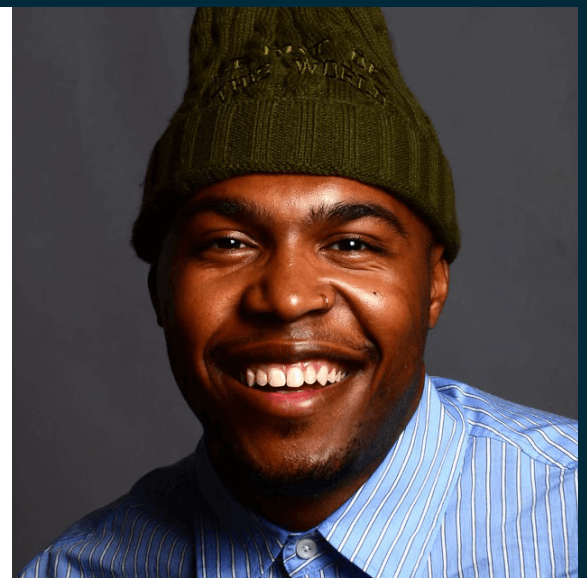
18. KATIE BRENNAN

21. AMBER MURAD

A former Somerset County Republican commission candidate, Murad is President of the newly-formed Forward Republicans initiative, aimed at fostering the next generation of young Republican leaders in the state.



22. JACK DEGROOT

The 24-year old Republican won a contested primary last year for Sussex County Commissioner, and subsequently won the general election, with a vow to 'ensure that future generations will have the same opportunities I had growing up'.

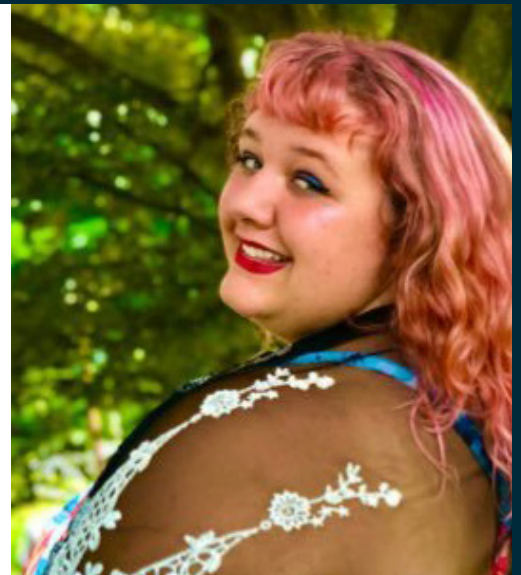
23. REBECCA SCHWARTZ JUAN CARLOS NORDELO KAYLEE MCGUIRE DYESE DAVIS MATT CLARKIN

Founded by Matt Anderson, the Millennials For New Jersey PAC has a proven track record of supporting young candidates in both parties across the state, and remains an influential organizing entity for young people. In addition their leadership at M4NJ, Schwartz, Nordelo, McGuire, Davis, and Clarkin are all rising stars individually.



24. ZOE HEATH

The founder of Sussex County Pride, Heath was elected chair of the Sussex County Democratic Committee last summer, and is currently the youngest county party organization chair in the state – by far.



25. JASI MIKAE EDWARDS

Overcoming teen pregnancy and homelessness, Edwards was part of the formation of a youth council in Trenton, and in 2022 was elected as a Councilwoman-at-Large in the Capital City.



26. MUSSAB ALI

The former Jersey City Board of Education President and Harvard graduate took a break from politics, but is making his comeback as a mayoral candidate in the city's upcoming mayoral race. He is the founder of the Ali Leadership Institute, which works to empower up and coming young leaders, and was recently chosen as one of 100 members nationally of Youth250, an organization aimed at amplifying young voices in commemorating America's 250th anniversary.

28. JAMES SOLOMON

The Ward E Councilman from Jersey City has been an outspoken advocate for political reform, and is a strong contender in the city's upcoming mayoral race in 2025.



29. PEARL GABEL, MEGAN CRYAN, SAM BERMAN, HIRA SHAIKH & JOE LIBUTTI

Individually, the five have impressive skillsets and accomplishments; together, they combine to make a powerhouse communications and public affairs team under Maggie Moran's leadership at Moxie Strategies.



30. BILLY PREMPEH

A millennial veteran and Paterson native, the three-time Republican candidate for Congress in the 9th District nearly defeated Congresswoman-elect Nellie Pou, coming within 1-point of winning in the normally-reliably Democratic district. Prempeh didn't have much support from Republican organizations – after this year's nail-biter race, that may change when he expectedly runs again in 2026.



31. LESLYE MOYA AND KINN BADGER

The two operatives command respect as the leadership team helping the New Jersey State Democratic Committee, and their vantage points are critical to the party as it looks to make more inroads with young voters.



32. SUE ALTMAN

The former Working Families Executive Director embodied generational change during her spirited, though unsuccessful, campaign in the national battleground 7th Congressional District; she'll now be in a top spot as Senator Kim's State Director, with Lauren Bustamante serving as Deputy State Director.



33. MAYROSE WEGMANN AND ROB MATOS-MORAN

The two serve as the directors of the New Leaders Council-New Jersey, which continues to provide foundational support and guidance for emerging young leaders around the state. The group was founded in 2011 by Justin Braz and Jackie Cornell.

34. TONY PERRY

The Middletown Mayor convincingly won re-election in November and is set to begin his third term on the township committee. He hasn't shied away from criticizing state policies with which he disagrees, and is poised for higher office in the future.



35. NOHEMI SORIA-PEREZ

An at-Large Councilwoman in the City of Camden, Soria-Perez serves as the Chief of Staff for the 5th District legislators and has prioritized youth engagement programs in the city.



36. MIKE CRISPI

The 'America First Republicans' New Jersey chair was a leading booster of President-elect Trump, and had a featured speaking slot at his Wildwood rally this summer. A former podcaster who once ran for Morris County commissioner, Crispi's stock is rising and his voice more influential following the statewide results of the presidential election, which came as a shock to many – but not to Crispi. He is reportedly considering entering the Republican gubernatorial primary.



37. MICHAEL SULEIMAN

The veteran Atlantic County Democratic Chairman has served as party chair since 2016, and is the founder of the think-tank South Jersey Forward. He doesn't plan to run again for chair in 2026 – marking ten years of service – but with his remaining time, he's making it a priority to mentor and mold up-and-coming young leaders in the county.



38. JESSE KURTZ

The Atlantic City councilman is a veteran on the governing body and for years was the lone Republican – next year, his clout and influence will increase as another Republican joins him on the dais.



39. LEE CLARK

The first African-American councilman in Phillipsburg's history, Clark was elected Chairman of the local Democratic Committee earlier this year, with one of his goals being to 'engage the next generation of voters coming of age'.

40. SAM DEALMEIDA

A powerful voice for young Republicans and a respected leader in the construction industry, DeAlmeida is the President of the Associated Builders and Contractors of New Jersey, the youngest-ever in the position.



41. ASKAR MIRZA

The 19-year old waged a winning candidacy for a Ridgefield commission seat earlier this year, serves as a Bergen County Republican committee member and is a member of the statewide Youth Council with the Department of Children and Families.



42. KATE MIRNE

Mirne serves as the President of the New Jersey High School Republicans, which earlier this year held a successful event featuring Republican gubernatorial and congressional candidates.



43. BRANDON UMBA

The former 8th Legislative District Assemblyman served in the lower chamber in the previous legislative session, one of its youngest members. He was defeated by only a handful of votes in 2023, but he's looking to make a comeback in 2025, as Republicans look to build upon their statewide electoral strength shown in this year's presidential election.



44. SAM JOSHI

The Edison mayor, in his early 30s, is serving his first term leading the state's fifth largest municipality, and has been outspoken on controversial issues.



45. TYLER BURRELL

The Councilman from Delran was first elected to the governing body at age 19 in 2019, and in November of this year won election to Burlington County's Board of Commissioners. When he is sworn-in, he'll be among the youngest county commissioners in the state.

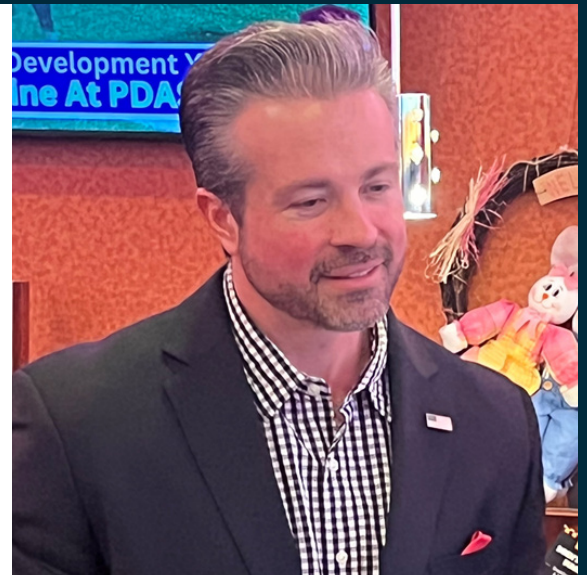
50. MICHAEL MANNING

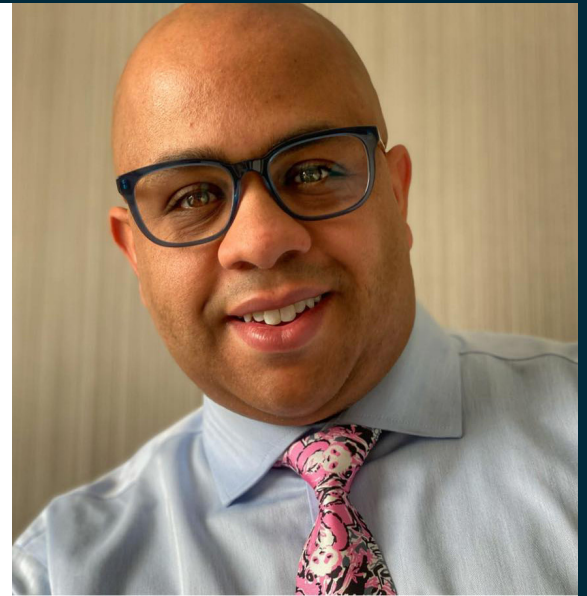
